Pop up Pump Track at Korau Road Reserve, Tikipunga

Dear Resident.

The Whangarei District Council are installing a 'pop up' pump track at Korau Road Reserve on Friday 21 February.

The installation will take one day with the bulk of the work happening in the reserve space behind the playground. The works do not require any traffic management or road closures.

Free for everyone to enjoy, the pump track is a modular track, made up of different pieces that can be packed up and moved from one place to another in one day.

The track will stay at Korau Road Reserve for approximately six months before it is moved to its

The track includes a circuit of hills and bumps, rollers, banked turns and features designed to be ridden by scooters, skateboards and bike riders pumping to get momentum by up and down body movements, instead of pedalling or pushing.

No motorised vehicles or electric scooters are allowed on the track.


Visitors to the pump track can access Korau Road Reserve from Korau Road or Hinau Street. We are also recommending visitors bike, skate or scoot to the track from the Kamo Shared Path.
